





CONNECTING UTAH OVERVIEW FLYER - SPANISH



Utah Broadband Center Asking County Residents To Help Identify Areas With High-speed Internet Connectivity Needs

The public can provide input through an online survey, taking the speed test, and/or a phone call

SALT LAKE CITY (March 22, 2023) — The Utah Broadband Center (UBC), part of the Governor's Office of Economic Opportunity, is asking for input from county residents to identify areas with low or no access to highspeed internet.

As part of its Connecting Utah initiative, UBC is working to make high-speed internet accessible and affordable to every resident. Utah received funds through the federal Broadband Equity, Access, and Deployment program and the Digital Equity Act to develop a five-year action plan to expand access to affordable high-speed internet in unserved and underserved areas of the state.

Once the unserved and underserved locations are identified, UBC will develop strategies to increase internet access and incorporate these strategies into the five-year action plan.

"Access to reliable and affordable high-speed internet for every Utahn is our goal," said Gov. Cox. "High-speed internet allows our communities to access online opportunities for work, education, healthcare, commerce, and other essential quality-of-life services."

Residents can provide input as well as request accommodations, such as language translation, in any of the following ways:

Many Utahns not only need internet connectivity, but access to high-speed internet. Lack of infrastructure, devices, digital skills, and affordability issues make accessing online resources difficult for some Utahns. According to the <u>Utah Census Bureau's 2021 American Communities Survey</u>, more than 70,000 Utah households need internet connectivity and even more do not have high-speed internet access.
